



James E. Austin

Snider Professor of Business Administration, Emeritus, Harvard University

James Austin is the Snider professor of business administration emeritus at the Harvard Business School, which is the third chaired professorship he has held at HBS where he has been on the faculty since 1972. He was also the co-founder and chairman of the HBS Social Enterprise Initiative.

Professor Austin has authored and edited 16 books, including the award winning *The Collaboration Challenge: How Nonprofits and Businesses Succeed Through Strategic Alliances*. He is recognized internationally as an expert on social enterprise, cross-sector collaboration, and management in developing countries. Professor Austin has published dozens of articles and hundreds of case studies and has been an advisor to corporations, nonprofit organizations, and governments throughout the world, including serving as a special advisor to the White House. He is also one of the founding leaders of the Social Enterprise Knowledge Network (SEKN) and co-author of *Social Partnering in Latin America* (Harvard University Press 2004).

Professor Austin's doctorate and MBA degrees with distinction are from Harvard. His BBA with high distinction is from the University of Michigan.
